The roll was called, we have a quorum at 6:55PM. The motion to adopt the minutes and the agenda was moved and seconded. A presentation was given by Columbia's School for Math, Science and Engineering by Miriam Nightengale, Principal. Il informed the Board that this is the school mentioned in the CBA. MD asked if Columbia could not provide space as an in-kind service for this school. Ms. Nightengale responded that there was an agreement between Columbia and the City that Columbia would provide the land and then City would build the school. The City then sent a letter to Columbia saying they would not build a school and the school was never built. It was the City's decision not to build a school. MD asked why Columbia could not provide the space. The Chair responded that this is something that we should be involved in and ask questions in a letter to Columbia asking about the disposition of the land. Youth and Education can write this letter and keep abreast of the response. BW had questions about criteria and selection process. Test scores, attendance and lateness was the answer. About 200 students take the entrance exam and based on the score, exam, etc. they make sure the distances are balanced and that is the selection process. PJ asked about how many students are meeting the goals set and how the school is meeting requirements set forth in the CBA. Ms. Nightengale responded that she felt the school has achieved goals set forth in the CBA. The Board bid farewell to our Mr. Giovanni of the Borough President's office as this is his last meeting with him. The new person representing the Borough President's office is Diana Howard. We were introduced to our new members: Honorable Deidre McKintosh- Brown, Anthony Carrion, Eric George, Tina Glover, Daria Hardemen, Catherine Merette, Jose Taveras, Fatima Torres. The Chair thanked Mr. Giovanni for his service and wished him the best in all his endeavors. The new members gave a brief summary about themselves. The Chair encouraged new members to pair with someone who has been on the Board previously so that they can get a better understanding of how the Board works and what to do and have a solid foundation.

Assemblyman D. Farrell addressed the Board about what is going on in Albany. Rent stabilization is the primary issue. BW asked about the J-51 bill. Mr. Farrell stated that they are going to let it die.

The District Manager is not here this evening but her report is in the package. The Board will forgo committee reports this evening so that we can hear from the election committee.

The Treasurer's report is in the packet. The Treasurer was asked by Ms. Mack whether Councilman Levine's allocation had any restrictions or was it earmarked for anything specific. The answer was no. The Treasurer mentioned the Senior and Housing Forum to be held tomorrow May 22, 2015. The Chair outlined past years specific use of the discretionary funding. The Chairs report was not in the packet. The Teachers College Community School lost its principal. Principal Breedon suffered a fall and later succumbed to a blood clot in the brain. Savings from the program will go back into the hospital. Mr. John has been asked by St. Luke's to be sit on the Committee Advisory Board.

Joel Mentor did not reach a quorum in the Parks and Recreation committee. Wants members to join a partnership for park. CS asked for PEP telephone number because of un-leashed dogs at the 141% portion of the park.
