1.1st Speaker:

Dr. Forde. Chair: pendulum shifting, data, and research moved for cannabis for patients & social justice

Dr. Forde:

- 529 chemicals in cannabis, people think only of THC, 60 are active when we think of cannabis we think of THC, cannabinoids are abundant and nonpsychoactive
- Insomnia, neuropathic pain, nausea, anxiety, movement disorder use THC
- Arthritic pain, anti-inflammatory, cancer, IBS, antitumor, seizures, epilepsy, glaucoma, Parkinson's use CBD
- HEMP based CBD is what is everywhere, HEMP has only 1 or 2 cannabinoids.
 The better extract comes from the full plant, cannabis
- Cannabis was legal many years ago, through racial injustice became illegal,
 Nixon share created commission to study it, Shafer commission agreed it was good --Nixon ignored findings ignited a war on drugs
- US Govt has a patent on cannabis, even though they have it a schedule 1 narcotic—they know benefits
- NYstate medical marijuana program started in 2014, 1996 medical in California
- NY Jan 2016 Med July 2014 approved—2 years to come online
- Currently treating opioids disorder with cannabis to get off opioids
- at risk youth in Vancouver tested using cannabis to reduce opioid addictions, showing positive results
- Cannabis, not a gateway drug, helping exit. Ask why are so many young men medicating
- Still a class 1 drug, US backward in testing and research—Leading data coming outside the US, we are behind due to schedule 1 classification
- Illegal weed we do not know what it is laced with, no control- had a patient test
 positive for cocaine it was street marijuana laced with it
- Medicinal cannabis is higher tested regulated: quality is better. no actual buds/flower in NYstate only vape, oil capsule

- Mark Wallace center in San Diego doing clinical trials
- Illegal market in California still thriving,
- NY state does not have west coast products, vape pen, oil and pills
- Topicals not available until we legalize: need flower & topicals in NY state
- Can see recreational dispensaries late 2020
- Edibles 2 hours to take effect, last up to 8 hours**** be careful
- Side effects: no one can OD on cannabis, never has like opioids t most munchies
- Under the age of 18 not recco THC products
- Q: does MJ make you psychotic? no
- Many people are self-medicating
- COMT lack an enzyme at risk for paranoid
- Cannabis hyper syndrome nausea vomiting smoking too much
- Comment: can smoking cause heart issues, no evidence
- Convo on the endocannabinoid system
- Convo on teens and cannabis use study in Penn
- Impact on our community has been negative
- Chair: we need to teach people about it
- Convo about opioid issue/racial
- The age range in her patient 60-90 now, 92 years old for cannabis most recent need to get churches involved where our communities learn, teach pastors
- Pharma fighting legalization
- War on drugs failed/ change re-educate
- How do we inform people about functions: re-educate in all forms
- Insurance: not all take it Dr working with Cuomo medical only cash or debit
- Discussion about cost and lack of affordability
- Need for policy revs on medical marijuana equity access
- Come up with a good way of testing vs breathalyzer
- CHAir: today anyone can take ambient and drive, need to educate moderation and responsibility

LONG TERM GOAL IDEA/ACTION FORUM:

Sept education on Medicare/Medicaid, need to be alerted educated on the Affordable Care Act, enrollment periods. Medicaid forum/private long term care plan, .. maybe its table at senior centers or other places during the summer. Educate community

- **Secondary prevention** awareness of services in the community (Diabetes, obesity, hypertension, STD/STI and violence)
- **SHORT/LONGTERM:** Asthma, Lead-where you live matters to your health. View properties with the high violations and unhealthy correlations
- LONG TERM: Columbia construction updates, noise complaints, and secondhand smoke (cannabis) landlords have to come up with smoking plans public (this is now a city law)
