Manhattan North – Det. Rijo reported that there is a decrease in crime borough wide. Grand larceny in vehicles and assault has increased and murder went down. Stats attached

26th Precinct – P.O. Jason Harper reported that grand-larceny has increased, robberies have increased but there is a 90% arrest and most occurrences are at St. Nicholas and Morningside Park. Felony has increased and 1 incident of domestic violence was reported. P.O..... reported that there is an issue concerning graffiti at the Fairways and Columbia Properties on 12th Avenue along the Amtrak rail lines. The 26th Precinct is seeking assistance in cleaning the graffiti and stated that the volunteers or crew need to take the Amtrak Safety Course. 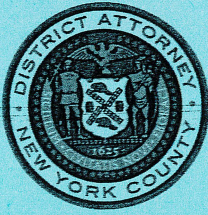
