Meeting was called to attention at 6:45 p.m. without a quorum.

The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming the committee members and the guest.

Discussion:

Community Benefits Agreement (CBA)

The Chair distributed handouts providing a summary of the CBA with Columbia University and reviewed several keys areas of the agreement that were currently in place and others that could be implemented upon request to the University. This was followed by questions from several of the attendees as to the progress of these programs.

The Chaired followed up by distributing a second handout that described programs that were currently in place and the parameters of each program. In addition, it was pointed out that an on-line annual report is submitted to the monitoring state agency (Empire State Development Corp.). The annual reports provide details of the University's activities for each of the engagement services from promoting the activity/program to final results. As an example several programs were identified:

Mobile Pre K Dental Center - the annual report provides the daycare centers the dental visited during the i year

Mobile Dental Center for Seniors "

40 Undergrad Scholarships for area youth – the report provides the zip codes of the scholarship recipients Teacher College Community School and Columbia Secondary School

It was stressed that all committees examine these reports to determine whether any shortfalls existed and where the committee could assist in promoting programs/services. The Chair stated that he will be emailing the annual reports related to each committee to the committee Co-Chairs this week for their review.

Criminal Justice Reform

A review of this past year's activities was provided by the Chair, highlighting the following areas: Prevention / Bail /Re-entry Programs for the formerly incarcerated / Anticipated Youth HUB
