FDNY

Reported:

Fire Safety for Children – Most small children have a natural curiosity about fire. They want to know how fire looks and feels, what it can do, and how it will burn. Children, including toddlers cause thousands of home fires each year by playing with matches, lighters or candles. The average age of a person dying in this type of fire is four years old.

Most fires caused by children playing with lighters matches or candles tend to begin in bedrooms. The most common items ignited are the mattresses and bedding. Disturbingly, many young children tend to hide under beds or in closets during house fires; especially fires they've started.

What Parents and Caregiver can do to combat fires ignited by children:

- ✓ Have a matches and lighter round-up. Ask your children to tell you where all the matches and lighters are located throughout the home;
- ✓ Store lighters and matches out of sight and reach preferably in a locked cabinet or drawer. This includes multi-purpose or barbecue style lighters;
- ✓ Check under beds and in closets for burned matches or hidden lighters. Approximately half of the child fire starters had previously played with matches or a lighter;
- ✓ Use a "don't touch" approach with children under five years of age. Instruct them to show you any unattended matches or lighter;
- ✓ Instruct older children to bring matches or lighter to you;
- ✓ Smokers should be conscious of children in the home and keep their smoking materials out of sight and reach of children

Every season brings its own safety hazards. During the summer months there is an increased risk of fire associated with the use of barbecues, gasoline, air conditioners and other electrical appliances. FDNY encourages everyone to be safe during the Summer by protecting themselves and their family the following precautions:

Open Fire Hydrants an open fire hydrant without a sprinkler cap wastes 1000 gallons of water per minute -- as much in an hour as an entire family of four uses in a year!! Open fire hydrants will also hamper fire-fighting capabilities, putting your neighborhood at risk.

Amateur use of Fireworks can lead to devastating burns, other injuries, fires and even death. For these reasons, the possession and use of any fireworks, without exception, is illegal in New York City.

Light Your Fire in Safety every year barbecue grills on residential properties causes more than 1,500 structural fires and 4,200 outdoor fires. Many of these fires occurred when a propane grill was used for the first time after winter storage.

DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS ADVISES PROPERTY OWNERS & CONTRACTORS TO TAKE PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES & ELIMINATE STANDING WATER

The New York City Department of Buildings advises property owners and contractors that outdoor structures that retain standing water may attract mosquitoes and act as breeding grounds. Mosquitoes pose a public health hazard and may carry diseases that are dangerous to humans, such as the Zika, West Nile, and St. Louis encephalitis viruses. Property owners and construction contractors are required to take measures to minimize standing water on their sites to help reduce the presence of mosquitoes.

How Does Water Help Mosquitoes Breed?

Studies show that female mosquitoes prefer to lay eggs in stagnant water or standing water left unattended for a period of three or more days. Stagnant or standing water can be found throughout construction sites and on properties wherever there are areas or items that collect water and aren't able to drain properly.

What Should You Do?

Contractors are encouraged to ensure that water removal plans for construction sites are strictly followed. Sites must be routinely checked for stagnant or standing water, and when necessary treated with the appropriate insecticide if elimination of water is not feasible. Accumulated water throughout a site should be removed promptly when possible. Contractors should be mindful of water that can collect in excavated areas, pipes, tarps, and barrels.

Homeowners should check their property to eliminate common mosquito breeding grounds. It is important to keep in mind that water can collect in unused flower pots, buckets, cups, and discarded tires, which provide an ideal habitat for mosquitoes.

A few steps homeowners can take to reduce standing water include:

- Pick up trash, such as styrofoam containers, that can collect water;
- Clear clogged rain gutters;
- Cover bins, wading pools, and other items that can hold standing water for extended periods of time; and change the water in bird baths and pet dishes regularly.

The Department suggests consulting a professional to advise on how to address potential mosquito breeding grounds in and around construction sites.

Homeowners and Residents are encouraged to call 311 to report unsafe conditions, or 911 to report emergencies at construction sites or buildings.

HRA:

Reported: Mayor Bill de Blasio announced a comprehensive plan to ensure homeless services are delivered as efficiently and effectively as possible with a focus on both preventing vulnerable New Yorkers from becoming homeless and rehousing individuals and families in shelter into permanent housing. The plan is the result of the 90-day review of homeless services ordered by the Mayor and incorporates and builds on the many reforms that were announced during the review period. The first part of the plan, full implementation of the HOME-STAT outreach program for street homeless individuals. The plan also includes measures to improve conditions and safety in shelters.

To ensure all resources are focused on prevention and rehousing:

- The City will implement an integrated management structure with both the Human Resources Administration (HRA) and the Department of Homeless Services (DHS) reporting to a single Commissioner of Social Services (DSS), current DSS/HRA Commissioner Steven Banks.
- Prevention and rehousing operations at DHS will be consolidated with groups that perform the same function at HRA. DHS's Homebase prevention unit will join HRA's Homelessness Prevention Administration.

A unified HRA management structure based on the veterans move out initiative will focus on finding permanent housing for shelter residents.

- DHS will focus on managing and improving shelter operations, including developing new types of shelters;
- The two agencies will share administrative support services resulting in substantial savings;
- To advance accountability for preventing and alleviating homelessness across multiple City agencies, the City will create an Interagency Homelessness Accountability Council reporting to the Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services Herminia Palacio.

There are four key elements to the new plan – prevention, rehousing, street homelessness outreach and improving shelter conditions – and a total of 46 individual systemic reforms. As a result of the proposed reforms, there will be administrative and programmatic savings estimated at \$38 million by eliminating duplicative administrative operations and streamlining management, which will offset new program costs of \$66 million that was presented in the Executive Budget.

SNAP: On demand is now available throughout the entire borough of Manhattan. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program - SNAP (formerly known as “food stamps”) provides food assistance for nearly 1.8 million low-income New Yorkers including families, the elderly and the disabled. The program helps families and individuals supplement the cost of their diet with nutritious foods.
