**FDNY Reported:** 43 Structural Fires within District 9 (see Stats);

**EMS Reported:** There were 40 cardiac arrest reported between 4/4/15 – 5/10/15, stated average response time is 4minutes.

**Summer Youth Police Academy 2015** – The New York City Police Department seeks to provide innovative and effective programs for the city's young people, and the Community Affairs bureau's Youth Police Academy is designed to establish a positive relationship between the Police department and the City's youth. New York City residents, attending school, between 10 and 16 years old are eligible to attend. The goals of the Academy are: To enhance responsible citizenship; To provide positive interaction with police officers and to educate young people about the challenges and responsibility of police work; and to encourage young people to take part in other youth programs offered by the Police Department such as: The Law Enforcement Explorers, Police Cadet Corps and the Police Athletic League.

**HRA Reported:** ACCESS NYC was re-launched (at [www.nyc.gov/accessnyc](http://www.nyc.gov/accessnyc)) with a streamlined SNAP application and a new online SNAP recertification. Visitors must now create a new account in order to use website, the change in user accounts will not affect current benefits. Both the SNAP application and the new SNAP recertification provide users with a confirmation number once documents are successfully submitted.

**Medicaid Renewal is no longer available online:** With the ACCESS NYC upgrade, Medicaid renewals can no longer be submitted online. To renew coverage, Medicaid clients must complete and return their renewal form in the postage-paid envelope enclosed in the package mailed to client. **IDNYC is the new, FREE identification card for all New York City residents,** which gives individuals the opportunity to show who we are (New Yorkers). As a government-issued photo

identification card, IDNYC secures access to City services to the most vulnerable communities—the homeless, youth, the elderly, undocumented immigrants, the formerly incarcerated and others who may have difficulty obtaining other government-issued ID.

IDNYC cardholders can access services and programs offered by the City as well as by businesses. IDNYC helps enhance public safety, by serving as a recognized ID for interacting with NYPD. It also helps New Yorkers gain access to all City buildings that provide services to the public and is accepted as a form of identification for accessing numerous City programs and services. IDNYC also provides a dynamic series of benefits to cardholders, including a free one-year membership at many of the City's leading museums, zoos, concert halls, and botanical gardens.

**DEP Reported:** Croton Water Filtration Plant Activated, Croton which is the largest underground Filtration Plant and has the capacity to filter up to 290 million gallons of drinking water each day; the Plant will protect the City against the possibility of drought and the effects of Climate Change

DEP manages New York City's water supply, providing more than one billion gallons of water each day to more than nine million residents, including eight million in New York City. The water is delivered from a watershed that extends more than 125 miles from the city, comprising 19 reservoirs and three controlled lakes. Approximately 7,000 miles of water mains, tunnels and aqueducts bring water to homes and businesses throughout the five boroughs, and 7,500 miles of sewer lines and 96 pump stations take wastewater to 14 in-city treatment plants. DEP has nearly 6,000 employees, including almost 1,000 in the upstate watershed. In addition, DEP has a robust capital program, with a planned \$14 billion in investments over the next 10 years that will create up to 3,000 construction-related jobs per year. This capital program is responsible for critical projects like City Water Tunnel No. 3; the Staten Island Bluebelt program, an ecologically sound and cost-effective stormwater management system; the city's Watershed Protection Program, which protects sensitive lands upstate near the city's reservoirs in order to maintain their high water quality; and the installation of more than 820,000 Automated Meter Reading devices, which allow customers to track their daily water use, more easily manage their accounts and be alerted to potential leaks on their properties. 
#### **Agency Updates:**

**DOT: Announced the approval of CityBench site at: 2900 Broadway (bet. 113<sup>th</sup> & 114<sup>th</sup> St.).** The purpose of the three-year federally funded CityBench program is to install benches throughout New York City to support transit use and walking, particularly for the elderly and mobility-impaired. DOT typically installs benches on sidewalks that are at least 12 feet in width along bus routes, near senior centers, on commercial corridors, and near municipal, commercial, and recreational destinations. As City-owned property, the bench will be the responsibility of DOT should any issue(s) arise; DOT will also maintain the benches.

**DOB: Announced the appointment of John Waldman newly appointed Community Affairs Liaison for Manhattan (Westside) and Staten Island covering Manhattan CB's 2,4,5,7,9, and 12; Staten Island CB's 1,2, and 3. 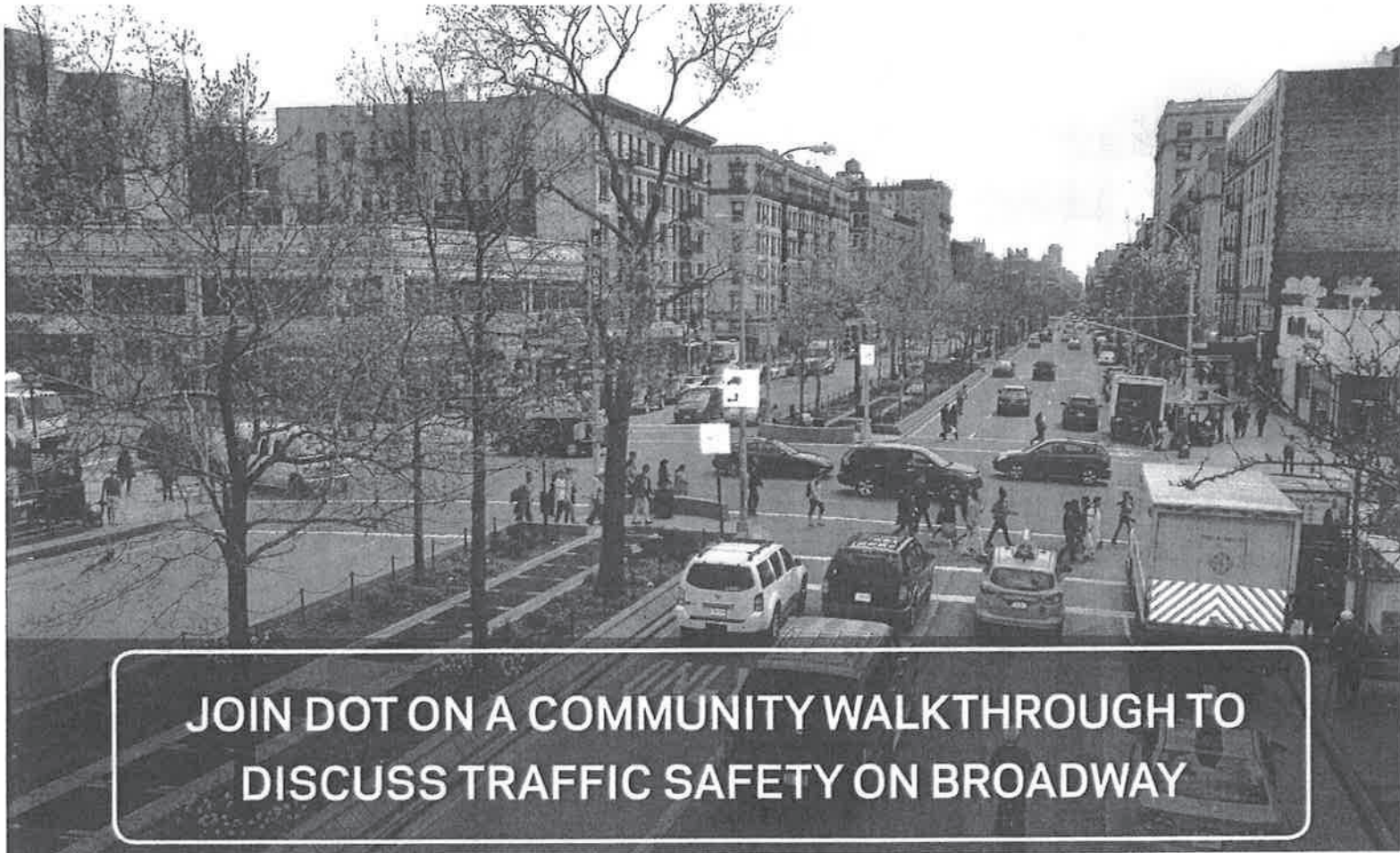

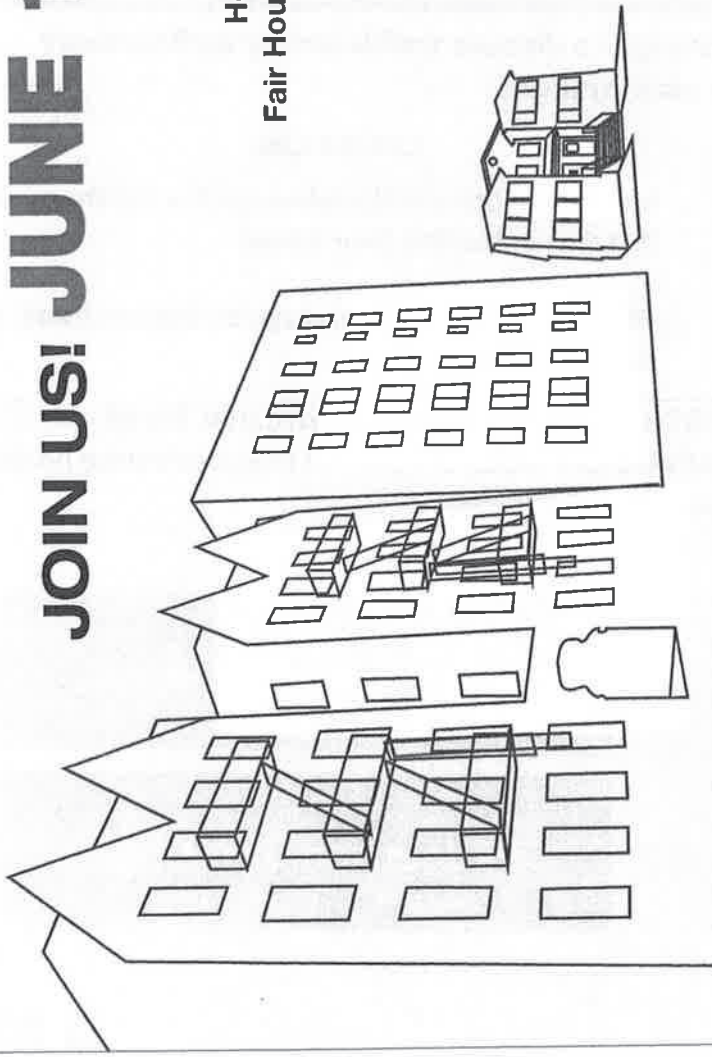
