Agency Update/Announcements:

Citizens Committee for New York City – Neighborhood Grants – Citizens Committee for NYC awards grants of up to \$3,000 to neighborhood groups, public school-based groups, and NYCHA tenants associations working to improve the quality of life across the city, including your local community.

Grants are an important resource for community groups, particularly in low-income areas, supported groups carry out projects as varied for community gardening, theater and fine arts, nutrition awareness, composting, tenant organizing, physical fitness, public safety, and more. The next grant deadline is January 27th 2014.

DSC Meeting Highlights (9/11/13):

FDNY (see Stats) – On Sunday, November 10th, 2013, at approximately 7:33 pm, a 26 precinct police car responded to a 911 call of a fire at 1440 Amsterdam Avenue. When

officers arrived at the scene, they immediately began evacuating people from the Associated Supermarket. The police supervisor on the scene conferred with the store manager who verified that all 20 of his employees were safely out of the building. The scene was immediately secured by responding officers by having vehicular and pedestrian traffic diverted from the area. F.D.N.Y. Battalion Chief Sinkevitch reported that the incident was a two alarm fire that started in the Mr. Bubbles Laundromat and spread to the connected Associated Supermarket. At approximately 8:00 pm, Battalion Chief Sinkevitch advised that the fire had escalated to a 3 alarm fire, and that there were no injuries. The Supermarket sustained heavy fire damage and total roof collapse. NYC Dept. of building representatives conducted an inspection of the structure and determined that the building required a complete tear down. North and southbound traffic between W. 128 Street and W. 133rd Street is expected to be diverted to Convent Avenue until the demolition of the structure is complete.

Update: Fire Site at 1440 Amsterdam Avenue Block: 1984/Lot: 28 has been declared for Immediate Emergency Declaration by the NYC Department of Buildings. It has been determined that the Fire and fire fighting operations have caused extensive fire, water and smoke damage to the ENTIRE premises which has compromised the structural stability with entire roof and exterior walls along exposure 1 collapsed and the remaining walls are in danger of further collapse. Demolish of premises to the safe level has been recommended.

Reported on Christmas Tree Fire Safety – check for “UL or “FM” labels on fire retardant trees; use only miniature “UL” or “FM” labels lights; Do Not use electric lights on metallic trees (use remote spot or reflective lights).

EMS – Reported In association with EMSC OGP 102-09, Addendum 1, Unit of the Month Recognition Program, the following unit is recognized as the Unit of the Month for September, 2013: Unit (16C2); Facility – Harlem; Commanding Officer – Captain Steven Cuevas. The Unit Citation in recognition of their exemplary service, the following members of the Bureau of EMS are awarded a Unit Citation: EMT Siul Paulino; EMT Eva Tashjian; EMT Robert Vales. Presentation of Certificates and Unit Citation ribbons will take place at Station 16 on Monday, November 25, 2013 at 9a.m.

26th Pct. Reported an increase in crime specifically in electronic theft, and fraud. (See Stats). On Wednesday, October 2nd, 2013, at approximately 9:24 pm a male black 42 years of age was shot in the lower left neck. According to investigators, the 28th precinct responded to a radio call of shots fired at the corner of West 123 Street and Manhattan Avenue. The victim later succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene. The above incident is being actively investigated by members of the 26th precinct Detective Squad.

30th Pct. (See Stats) – Reported the Christmas Senior Dinner will be held on Saturday, December 14th, 2-5p.m.; Children’s Christmas Party will be held on Saturday, December 21st, 10a.m. – 2p.m.

Patrol Borough Manhattan North (See Stats) – Reported Lieutenant Donzel Cleare has been assigned as the Commanding Officer for Patrol Borough Manhattan North; Registration for Winter Basketball Classic will begin on Saturday, December 7th; late registration: (If Rosters are not full) is scheduled for Saturday, December 14th, 9a.m. to Noon. (see Flyer)

HRA – Reported the Federal 2009 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act's (ARRA) provided a temporary increase to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), or food stamps, which ended on October 31, 2013. As of November 1, 2013, households will see a reduction in monthly benefits in New York City and across the nation. (see Notice)

On a free new online resource to help Public Assistance applicants and recipients apply and prepare for Administrative Fair Hearings. The New York LawHelp Consortium, under the auspices of Legal Services NYC and in collaboration with Legal Assistance of Western New York, Inc., have developed an interactive tool to help unrepresented Appellants understand the fair hearing process.

The Public Benefits Fair Hearing program was designed by a team of Public Benefits experts state-wide. It is written in plain language and is available in both English and Spanish. Users answer short questions in the online program and are given customized information. The Q&A style format leads the user not only through asking for a fair hearing in a timely fashion, but also how to prepare for and participate in the fair hearing itself. (see Flyer)

Human Rights Commission – Reported the Fair Business Practice is committed to helping businesses succeed including your efforts to recover and rebuild from Hurricane Sandy. A number of city agencies have programs to help you with financing, free legal advice; developing business opportunities recruiting employees, and securing permits and licenses.
