#### **Old Business:**

1. Artist Speaks Update - Melvin McCray, Filmmaker and Hon. Daria Hardeman

- a. Hon. Daria Hardeman gave a brief background of the project: Focus on individual artists and start conversation by initialing a video highlighting West Harlem artists and organizations; how pandemic affected artists a personal expression and an opportunity to capture the moment; interviews with artists to capture what they are going through at this time- collaborating with videographer; Mr. McCray at The Digital Media Training Program which produced "Harlem Through My Eyes" interviewing residents of Harlem.
  - b. Updates as to the status of the work will be forthcoming.
- 2. Development of a West Harlem Arts Organization Update and Resolution Hon. Daria Hardeman and Hon. Jonathan Sinagub
  - a. Hon. Daria Hardeman presented the draft Resolution.
- b. Discussion followed around issues of incorporating language such as "arts incubator", "funding for starting and sustaining". Changes were made to incorporate these additional ideas into the draft resolution.
