I. Call to Order/Attendance:

Attendance was taken by the 1st Vice Chair, Monique Hardin-Cordero. Attendance sign-in sheet collected by Eutha Prince. A quorum was met, and the meeting was called to order at 6:50 pm by Chair V. Edwards.

II. Adopt Meeting Agenda:

Motion to adopt the agenda made by V. Alexander. Seconded by M. Hardin-Cordero. The agenda is adopted by the members present.

III. Adopt Exec. Committee Minutes (from 06/12/2025):

IV. Presentations/Discussions/Updates:

- Harlem Rocket at the West Harlem Piers (Gary Johnson, Co-founder and CEO & Michael Preston, Co-Founder and VP of Govt. Affairs & Customer Service)
 - Launched out of Dyckman Marina
 - May 6th Christened the Hazel Dukes (100-person vessel)
 - Tours on the Hudson
 - They want to operate out of 125th Street
 - Awaiting a floating dock and a gangway
 - had to spend their resources to get approval for the infrastructure
 - invested a lot of personal funds to get the infrastructure in place
 - Only currently running one tour a day
 - Continuing to the end of the season October 15th
 - Received 500 resumes and conducted interviews
 - Hired 35 young people
 - Not able to give them the hours because they cannot do the number of tours
 - Access is limited from Dyckman Marina
 - Activate the waterfront in West Harlem
 - The Harlem Rocket founders are members of the US Navy League they want to bring Fleet Week up to Harlem
 - Tickets
 - Adults \$40. Seniors/Children \$35
 - Could not operate tours during the pandemic. Workforce and supply chain
 - The main barrier is the cost caused by the delays
 - Dyckman will undergo renovations at the summer season
 - Can the infrastructure be reused at Harlem Piers?
 - The boat has a Captain and two deckhands (certified via US Coast Guard)

• need about 10 full-time staff members per operational shift

- Did not expect where EDC finally decided to put them
 - Have to deal with Army Corps of Engineers, SBS, EDC, Parks Department, and DOB to get temporary infrastructure in place
- They feel that permanent infrastructure should be expensed by the City so that it can be used by others too
- Councilman Abreu put in a \$150K allotment in the budget
 - EDC was not certain it could allocate it for a profitable business, and EDC indicated that the funds may not be enough to install the necessary infrastructure
- Looking into the Educational Component
 - Partnering with Schools and Summer Programs
 - Younger generations need to know about Maritime opportunities
- Discussion on: NYC Community Planning Fellowship
 - Updates from Eutha
 - We get one intern for the fall
 - a. We had one a few years ago with Economic Development
