- The property has been in need of repairs for 10-15 years. Needs major renovations
- The building needs to be ADA compliant
- T. Kovaleff moves for unanimous consent. W. Alexander seconds the motion. The rest of the executive board members approve adding to the 5/18 Gen Board Meeting agenda.
- 4. LOS re: 1763 Amsterdam Ave. aka Child's Memorial Site
 - Church was purchased and torn down in 2016
 - DHS had plans to put in a shelter and studios for housing.
 - The community wants more sustainable housing for families
 - NYSAG Office/Tish James requires the developer to finish the project in 2 years
 - Broadway Housing pulled out of the deal. They have not built sanctuary spaces before.
 - Met with Vahdat family and said they could not adhere to NYSAG office guidelines
 - The shelter would also house families with pets and allow the Church to own 1st floor
 - Creating/funding Hamilton Heights Community Fund with NY Trust of \$250,000 and CB9 would decide how to allocate funds
 - Options right now are a Homeless Shelter or Luxury housing, affordable housing option is no longer optimal.
 - T. Kovaleff moves for unanimous consent. W. Alexander seconds the motion. D. Hardeman abstains. The rest of the executive board members approve adding to the 5/18 Gen Board Meeting agenda.
