- Co-Chair Veronica Savage highlighted that the committee roster has been cleaned up and had an accurate listing of 10 members.
- The committee welcomed newly appointed Co-Chair Marquis Bell. Deep appreciation was extended to
  outgoing Co-Chair Heather Jason for her invaluable expertise, dedication to community
  partnership-building, and the strong structural foundation she established for the committee's
  continued growth.

## **PRESENTATIONS**

St. Nicholas Park – Public Art Installation of <u>Greg Tate Horus in Harlem</u> at 133rd Street Presenters: Elizabeth Masella (NYC Parks), Brett Cook (Artist)

- Project Overview: The mid-October art installation is a piece honoring local Harlem hero Greg Tate, a
  visionary writer, musician and cultural architect who reshaped Black music and thought. A long-time
  critic for The Village Voice, Tate who focused on African American music and culture and was
  posthumously awarded a Pulitzer Prize Special Citation award in 2024 for his literary contributions.
- The central part of the artwork is made of two 4'X8' plywood panels framed with wood and plexiglass drawings, and wood brooms that extend approximately 3 ft. on both sides.

- Proposed Site: West 133rd Street and St.Nicholas Avenue secured to the metal fences that face the street with metal ties, steel airline cables and fasteners.
- Timeline: The art piece will be unveiled on October 19th from 12PM-4PM at 133rd Street and St. Nicholas and will be up for public view for a 12 month period.
- The unveiling on 10/19 will also feature live performances from Burn Sugar, the musical ensemble Tate founded.
- Responses: Presenters confirmed that the piece was designed to withstand the winter elements and foster intergenerational dialogue and connection within the community.

# **OLD BUSINESS UPDATES/ Landmarks Preservation Property Improvement Concerns**

- The committee reviewed September 2025 LPC report noting four violations all connected to the same address at
- Community Board 9 will continue researching concerns about decay of historic structures at identified addresses.
- Update was shared from Robert Stern, Acting President of the Morningside Heights Historic District Committee (MHHDC) on the status of the district and McGiffert Hall.
  - MHHDC continues to advocate for the expansion of the historic district and has submitted a Request for Evaluation, including one for McGiffert Hall. However, the Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) has not responded. MHHDC remains hopeful that a change in political leadership will revitalize LPC's mission and support the designation efforts. A similar request for the West Harlem Historic District remains pending.
