Mayor's Office Reported: Mayor Zohran Kwame Mamdani recently announced the appointment of the Commission on Government Efficiency (COGE), a Charter Revision Commission tasked with making City government work better for New Yorkers.

COGE will examine how the New York City Charter can better support public excellence by improving efficiency, modernizing city government and ensuring the government keeps pace with New Yorkers' needs. The commission will hold 10 public hearings across the five boroughs to hear directly from New Yorkers before proposals are brought to voters on the November ballot.

New York City Emergency Management Reported (NYCEM): Recently Mayor Zohran Kwame Mamdani and New York City Emergency Management (NYCEM) announced the launch of [Notify NYC](#)'s opt-in SMS short codes for summer 2026, enabling New Yorkers and visitors to receive real-time emergency notifications during major events taking place across the city this summer.

New Yorkers and visitors can text the keyword SUMMER26, SUMMER26ESP or SUMMER26FRE to 692-692 (NYCNYC) to receive alerts and event updates in English, Spanish and French, respectively. Message and data rates may apply.

New Yorkers and visitors can also receive updates through the Notify NYC WhatsApp Channel by following "Notify NYC - World Cup Alerts" in WhatsApp or by visiting on.nyc.gov/NNYCWhatsApp from a mobile device.

Board of Elections Reported: Key dates for the June 23, 2026 Primary Election:

Mail Registration:

Applications must be received by a board of elections no later than June 13, 2026 to be eligible to vote in the Primary Election.

In Person Registration:

You may register at your local board of elections or any state agency participating in the National Voter Registration Act, on any business day throughout the year but, to be eligible to vote in the Primary Election, your application must be received no later than June 13, 2026.

DOHMH Reported: NYC Health Department launched a [new public awareness campaign](#) encouraging New Yorkers to keep themselves and their family healthy by signing up for low- to no-cost health insurance through the department's free health insurance enrollment services. Through the campaign, the department seeks to expand health insurance coverage among underserved communities, making affordable health services more accessible to those who need them most. In total, over 5 million people in New York City are currently insured through low- or no-cost health insurance plans. Many of these New Yorkers may be eligible to renew or assess their options for health insurance in the near future.

The NYC Health Department provides free enrollment assistance through certified counselors to support individuals and families in enrolling in low- or no-cost health insurance through the New York State of Health Marketplace. Enrollment counselors offer guidance on health insurance and care options, assist with choosing a health plan and primary care provider, and help with renewing health insurance. Additionally, enrollment counselors can help with applications for other benefits, including SNAP. Services are available in multiple languages and accessible to everyone, regardless of immigration status.

This campaign comes at a critical time as changes at the federal level continue to impact people's health insurance coverage. Several changes in federal laws and funding threaten to cause hundreds of thousands of New York City residents to lose coverage. Starting January 2027, Medicaid work requirements will go into effect for certain Medicaid beneficiaries. Additional changes, such as more

frequent eligibility redeterminations, will make it harder for many Medicaid beneficiaries to stay enrolled.

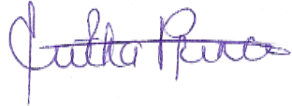
