MTA REPORTED: With the start of the new school year, MTA are reaching out to remind you that all Bronx local bus routes, including the **M100** and **M125**, saw a significant transformation on June 26, 2022, when the MTA implemented the Bronx Local Bus Network Redesign.

MTA is sharing this information with its constituencies via social media and any other communication methods to ensure that students know if their commute has changed before boarding the bus to school.

MTA is urging your students and caregivers to check out their student's trip before putting them on an MTA bus on the first day of school. Many bus lines saw changes to their routing, bus stops, and schedules.

The best resource to check out your trip is the "Plan a Trip" tool on new.mta.info or to download our apps before you travel. They'll give you up-to-the-minute information on subway, bus, and commuter rail arrivals, and you can save trips for the routes you take most often.

To further assist school kids, the MTA will be running a Customer Ambassador Program during the first week of school at key stops throughout the borough to help students navigate the changes in service. Look for MTA employees in orange vests near key stops on September 8, 9, 12, and 13. They will be out from 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., and from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. each day. To improve speeds, the Bronx Local Bus Network Redesign focused on simplifying and straightening circuitous routes and balancing bus stops. Since implementation, Bronx riders, on average, are experiencing shorter waits at bus stops, faster times once the bus arrives, and greater reliability of service. Some routes have had dramatic time savings, particularly the Bx36 crosstown route, saving over 10 minutes in each direction and up to 15 to 20 minutes during the rush hour.
